About This Segment

Effective classroom management includes clear procedures that allow teachers to maintain a learning environment. Lining up and traversing the hallways are some of the most basic classroom procedures. Hallway etiquette prevents students from losing focus and teachers from losing control.

Pre-viewing Discussion Prompt

- 1. Which classroom transitions are potential opportunities for students to lose focus and control?
- 2. How do clear procedures influence the other components of a holistic classroom management approach? (see graphic below)



Post-viewing Discussion Prompts

- From what you observed in the video, what benefits to students and teachers were associated with clear, established hallway procedures? E.g., improved teacher-student relationships, student-student interaction, classroom order and efficiency
- 2. What other benefits might you and your students gain from this strategy?
- 3. What are some key steps for successfully implementing this strategy? *E.g., establishing and communicating expectations, creating measurable criteria*
