## About this Segment

When teachers use text features to guide comprehension, students are better able to navigate a text. Features such as headings, illustrations, glossaries, and the table of contents help provide a mental framework for identifying and remembering the main ideas and key details of a text.

### Post-Viewing Discussion Prompts

- How can you teach students to use text features as a road map in preparation for reading a text?
